When can I get my second dose? It is confusing:

The good news is the you will be able to get your second dose sooner. The confusing part is they they keep moving dates. After reading a few [announcements](#), and scratching my head, this is what I understand (huge apologies if I'm wrong on any of this – please let me know) :

These people can BOOK NOW

- If you received Pfizer or Moderna at least 28 days ago for reasons other than age category: This means front line health care workers/medical reasons etc., but it's not clear if it includes other front-line workers such as retail and construction. That's a moving date, so as of today its May 10th.
- You are over 70 and received your dose of Pfizer or Moderna at least 28 days ago.
- Anyone else who got their first dose before April 18th. This includes all those people who got Astra Zeneca who can now book any of the three available vaccines. This seems to be a fixed date. (Remember to try [vaccine hunters](#) if you are having a difficult time)

The way it stands now, they will continue to open-up on the “first in first out” basis. If you received your first vaccination on April 19th, you are next.... And so on.

July 5 critical date for Phase 2 opening:

As of Sunday evening, for Ontarian over 12 years old, we've just achieved over 70% first vaccines. That's amazing!

The hard part will be getting to the 20% second dose. To reach this, almost every person who qualifies for a second dose will have to make sure they get it in their arm before July 4. It will be tight, so talk to your family and friends, and remind them to book as soon as they qualify. For those who don't qualify yet for their second dose, it's still super important you follow all the other health and safety guidelines because we still need for numbers (and particularly hospitalizations) to keep going down. You can still get covid, and only be mildly sick, but pass it onto someone unvaccinated.

Most days there are more people being discharged from hospital than there are being admitted, but we still have new admissions every day. We need to eliminate new admissions. I was on a zoom meeting last week with someone who worked in the ICU at North York general. I cried when he said that not one person in their ICU had been vaccinated, and everyone one of them could have been.

So, if you haven't been vaccinated yet, please re-consider your reasons, and make sure it's the best long-term choice for you.

A big shout out to all the 16 to 19 year-olds out there:

Over [50 %](#) Toronto's older teens lined up at places like pop up clinics and got their first dose in about 10 days. Many of them took parents and grandparents with them. It's worthwhile to note that it took the rest of the age categories at about 40 days to vaccinate their cohort to 50%.
